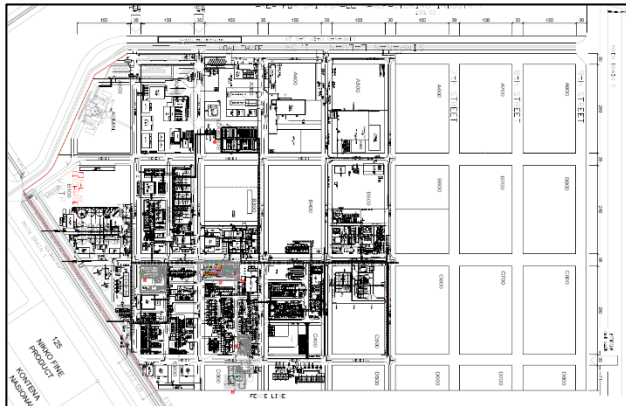

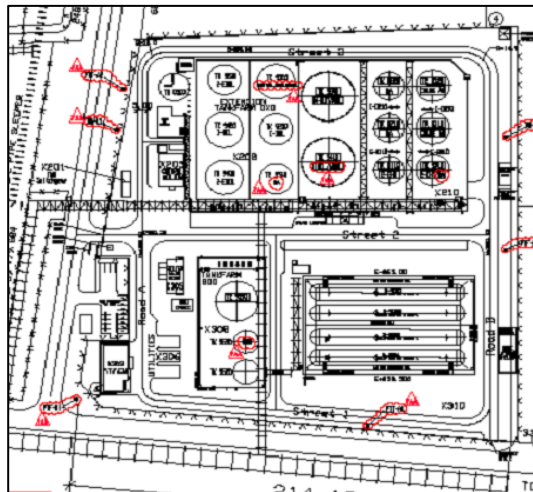

**COMPLEX INDUSTRIAL ACTIVITIES**

NO	PLANT FUNCTION
1.	Carbonylation, Condensation, Esterification, Hydrogenation, Hydrolysis, Oxidation, Distillation, Extraction, Solvation, Mixing
2.	Desulphurization, manufacture and transformation of sulphur-containing compounds
3.	Installations for distillation, refining or other process in processing of petroleum or petroleum products
4.	Installations for the total or partial disposal of solid or liquid substances by incineration or chemical decomposition
5.	Installations for the production, processing or treatment of energy gases, for example, liquefied petroleum gas, liquefied natural gas and synthetic natural gas

**LEGAL REQUIREMENTS**

The Occupational Safety and Health Act 1994 & Regulations (Regulations on the Control of Industrial Accident Hazards Regulations) 1996 stipulates that the task of the manufacturer is to supply information on its industrial activity to the public outside its industrial site which may be affected by a major accident occurring on an industrial site without they need to ask for it

**POSSIBLE DANGERS**

MAJOR ACCIDENT	EFFECTS TO RESIDENCES AND ENVIRONMENT
Fire and explosion	Injury which could be serious and fatal, damage to property and environmental destruction
Spills and leaks	Damage to property and environmental pollution

**WARNING AND EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS**

WHAT/WHO	DESCRIPTION
Emergency Siren Sounds	1. Siren sounded for 90 seconds (7 seconds/3 seconds). The siren is activated when emergency occurs within blockfield area
	2. Siren sounded for 90 seconds (1 second/1 second). The siren is activated when an emergency is caused by gas/vapour/fire from neighbouring blockfield area
	3. Siren sounded for 90 seconds without stopping. The siren is activated when affected area is clear of emergency
Shift Supervisor	Inform the Senior Production Manager and Plant Manager to execute emergency plans
BPC Authorised Personnel	Communicate with Authorities - provide incident update & safety precautions for their further action and onward communication to the general public
